

Shenhua welcomes new Project Manager

SHENHUA Watermark Coal have appointed a new project manager Paul Jackson, with experience in both China and Australia.

Mr Jackson is a former Project Director with BHP Billiton and brings with him more than 20 years experience in the construction and mining industries.

During his time with BHP, Mr Jackson worked on the Mt Arthur Coal expansion, where he took the operation from 8 Mtpa to 24 Mtpa over six years.
