

Amenities block is almost done at site

PROGRESS is being made on the Gunnedah Lions Club's latest project – an RV rest area at the edge of the attractive Wandobah Reserve on the Mullaley Road.

Local bricklayers Andrew Phillis and Michael Harris from Mick Harris Bricklaying have been on the job over the past week, laying almost 6000 bricks to complete the double brick walls in the amenities block.

The next step will be the roof, with the club utilising the skills of one of its members, local builder Greg Mackay, to oversee this section.

After the amenities block is complete, the club will move on to the rotunda before the internal roadworks are completed.

The Lions Club received a grant of \$230,000 from Shenhua Watermark Coal to assist the project with the club contributing \$10,000 and countless hours of voluntary labour.



THE Lions Club of Gunnedah RV rest area on the Mullaley Road is going up fast as the brickies and plumber move out and the roof builder moves in.

According to the Campervan and Motorhome Club of Australia, RV tourists spend an average of \$500 per week when on the road and 97 per cent make purchases when stop-

ping in a town on such items as fuel, vehicle maintenance, groceries, medical expenses, visiting attractions, eating out and accommodation.
