## **New Werris Creek Community Shed**

\$58,216 State
Government toontribution towards the
cost of the planned new
community shed last
Friday by Kevin
Anderson MP, Member
for Tamworth.

The funding was part of \$300,000 distributed across the electorate, including to Attunga Rodeo Association and to the Tamworth Community College for repairs and restoration works to preserve its heritage building.

Mr Anderson said there was strong competition for the available funds and a high level of interest from the community.

"I congratulate all those groups who were successful and I sincerely encourage those who missed out on this occasion to try again next time," he said.

"1 am also encouraging the community groups who have received funding to employ construction tradesmen/businesses and buy local. If we do, we could see this money go round and round our community a couple of times," Mr Anderson said.

The Werris Creek Community Shed has gone from strength to strength since its inception in 2009 with members meeting every Monday, Wednesday and Friday morning from 9.00am until noon in the Cusa hall building in the grounds of the former Werris Creek Catholic School. Members share including skills carpentary and

leadlighting and provide ongoing social support and friendship for each other.

The Community recently Shed has submitted their Development Application (DA) for the new Werris Creek Community Shed. The DA will be on display at The Liverpool Plains Shire Council Chambers and at the Werris Creek library until April 19 with written submissions to be submitted to LPSC prior to 5.00pm on April

construction can begin
in Single Street, next to
the Rural Fire Service
shed, "as soon as the DA
goes through and
Council gives us the
OK."

"We aim to get the concrete slab down, purchase and get the steel shed erected and then we will know where we are up to with money and what we will need to fit the new shed out," Mr Cunningham said.

"We would also like to give as much work to local contractors as possible," he said.
