

Watermark Community Fund opens for 2012



Watermark Communications Manager Melanie Layton is urging applicants to 'think outside the square'.

Now into its fourth year, the Shenhua Watermark Community Fund is calling for applications for its 2012 round of funding.

Having already

distributed \$3 million on 21 community projects, Watermark Communications Manager Melanie Layton is calling for organisations and

community groups this year to 'think outside the square' when preparing their application.

"What does your community really need? This is the question we want the public to think about when preparing an application," Ms Layton said. "We need to make this remaining \$2 million count."

According to Ms Layton, Projects that exceed the \$1 million will also be considered.

"Part of the 2013 community fund can be used to pay 2012 projects if they exceed \$1 million.

"Groups need to start talking to each other," Ms Layton continued. "Rather than working in

isolation, think about what it is you want to achieve and who you could partner with to make the most of this exciting opportunity."

The Watermark Community Fund Advisory Committee is running a number of information sessions to help applicants better prepare their submissions for a share in the remaining \$2 million.

The community information sessions will be held at the Shenhua Office, Gunnedah on Wednesday May 9 from 5.00pm - 6.00pm and Werris Creek Bowling Club, Thursday May 10 from 5.00pm - 6.00pm.

"We received 104

applications last year and a number of these did not address the criteria of the Fund," Ms Layton said. "Completing the application form can be very daunting and take a lot of time. We want to try and eliminate that time by providing advice on whether a proposal meets the criteria prior to putting the work into the application."
